<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1) Consistency of corresponding membership in each assembly. 2) The COG's reasoning is that having corresponding members on a committee is equivalent to them having a voice on issues in Congress or Assembly. 11.5.3 of the Certificate Assembly Bylaws specifies that Voting Members have a right to a voice and vote on all questions and that Non-Voting members have a right to a voice on all questions but shall not vote on issues. Both Voting (DA and CA) and Non-Voting members (CA) can be accredited. Corresponding membership is intended for organizations or entities that wish to receive information (updates, newsletters, meeting information, etc.) until such time as they are ready to apply for membership under one of the other categories. 			

21.5.1 (A)(2) Corresponding Member: ~~Organizations or individuals~~shall include organizations or institutions interested in accreditation of fire, emergency management, emergency medical, public safety, and related postsecondary programs may become corresponding members by payment of an annual fee. Corresponding members may not vote as members of IFSAC and are not eligible for accreditation. However, if otherwise eligible, they may serve on committees and special working groups, and otherwise fully participate in the activities of the Assembly.who wishes to receive IFSAC information until such time as they are ready to apply for membership under one of the categories specified in this article.Corresponding members shall be members in good standing.
